MESSAGE FROM EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR Erin Nelson

Thanks to the generosity of donors throughout the region, Jessica's House grief support groups benefitted 971 individuals in 2018. During a time of unimaginable heartache, groups provide grieving children, youth and their adult caregivers with moments of connection, expression through art and play, and opportunities to share and practice coping skills. Groups provide comfort, support and a safe place to grieve.

Donations to Jessica's House also provide funding for our HopeBringers Team, which in 2018 responded to critical incidents for 166 children and teens affected by the death of a fellow student or teacher. Throughout the year, we also worked alongside law enforcement to bring much-needed comfort to those affected by violent deaths.

In 2018, individuals and businesses rallied to support the mission of Jessica's House through fundraising events like Festival of Trees, Dancing With The Turlock Stars, Golf for Jessica's House, and the Bee Positive Foundation's Kayla Bernardi Fun Run and Walk. Several other community fundraisers, along with the generosity of individual donors, raised a total of \$281,463.00 for grieving families.

The results from our annual family survey showcased the impact of our services. Children were helped well beyond what families anticipated with improvements in school performance, restful sleep, grief expression, family communication and an overall sense of well-being. Research shows that unsupported grief during childhood adversely impacts physical and mental health. This assures us that the work we are doing makes a difference. Our staff and volunteers are highly respected for establishing an atmosphere of trust and genuine caring.

2018 was also a year when our leadership looked to the future, with vision and resolve to increase and strengthen our capacity to deliver best-practice grief support. Our work and our growth would not be possible without you. Thank you for your support.

Sharing Grief, Healing Together

Jessica's House support groups offer community and hope for families grieving a death.

Organized by age and type of loss, all groups are facilitated by trained volunteers who are in turn coordinated by the professional staff at Jessica's House. Groups incorporate trauma informed practices with sensory based art activities that create peer support connections and foster expression.

As one of our moms recently expressed, "Being in group is like taking a deep breath. It's the only time I feel truly comfortable talking openly about my grief. My heart rests knowing my children are getting the support they need after the loss of their dad."

In 2018, 620 children, teens, young adults and their family members attended bi-weekly support groups at Jessica's House. Groups offered include: Sibling Loss, Parent Loss, Hope After Suicide and Hope After Homicide. We also offer monthly groups for grandparent loss and "HeartStrings," for stillbirth and pregnancy loss.

Additionally, 351 students attended weekly groups in our local schools.

Community Resources

Jessica's House also provides grief education, training and onsite support if a death impacts a school or organization. Below is a summary of resources we offer the community:

SCHOOL TRAINING: Training for teachers, school administrators, and county agencies. Prepare your place of education with issues of grief and trauma or if a tragedy should occur.

SERVICE CLUBS: We welcome the opportunity to share our knowledge as a guest speaker at one of your upcoming events or meetings.

COMMUNITY RESPONSE TEAM: Our CRT consists of highly trained personnel who work alongside law enforcement and emergency responders in times of critical incidences involving children.



A Family's Story

Mike, Genesis and Mariah

Mike began taking his daughters, Genesis, age 10, and Mariah, age 8, to Jessica's House following the death of their mother, his wife Zenaida, in 2018. Zenaida received a very late stage diagnosis of cancer. Mike and Zenaida met at church through a mutual friend. She was hardworking, earned a master's degree in business and worked as a CPA. "She was loving, happy, and she loved life," Mike remembers. Zenaida loved spending time with her daughters and family, as well as traveling, being at the beach and hiking in the Carmel area.



The family was devastated when Zenaida died and Mike realized his family needed a place to heal. Mike learned about Jessica's House, and after taking them there for support, he noticed a change in his girls immediately. They met friends and realized they were not alone. It gave the family an overall sense of hope. The girls participate in a group where all of the children have experienced the death of their mom. Mike also finds comfort in a support group with other adults who can talk about the loss of their spouse.

"The thing I like best about Jessica's House is that I get to be with other kids who also lost somebody they love," says Genesis. "I've learned that you should always talk to people when you are feeling sad, and that's what I do at Jessica's House. Also, the food helps me feel better."

During the past year, Jessica's House began planning for the growing needs of grieving families in the Central Valley. We have identified the resources needed to transition Jessica's House from a small, rented space, to a permanent home that can meet the needs of the community long term.

Our business plan aims to achieve the following impacts:

- · More children, teens and families in grief will get the support they need.
- · Jessica's House will be more sustainable, with a lower cost per person served.
- Jessica's House will be more effective, modeled after a best practice environment for child bereavement support based on leading programs nationwide.

We look forward to sharing the business plan with contributors to Jessica's House during the months ahead.
